Rising Distemper Cases in Santa Cruz County SCCAS Encourages Pet Owners to Vaccinate Pets

The Santa Cruz County Animal Shelter (SCCAS) continues to see an increase in distemper cases in coyotes and racoons within Santa Cruz County. Animal Control Officers have been responding to cases predominately on the West Side of Santa Cruz, but cases are starting to move throughout the County with cases in Seabright. Distemper is a contagious viral disease that affects a wide variety of animals and has no known cure. Dogs can be infected and the only way to prevent this is to vaccinate dogs against the virus.

SCCAS offers the following services to Santa Cruz County resident pets Monday-Friday from 1pm-3pm:

- Dog rabies vaccine is \$10 with dog license renewal purchase (\$29 for an altered pet and \$100 unaltered). First time dog licensees will receive a FREE rabies vaccine with dog license purchase
- Cat rabies vaccines are \$10
- Microchips for dogs and cats are \$15 (includes registration)
- Distemper/Parvo (DA2pp) vaccines are \$20
