## LEO'S HAVEN/CHANTICLEER PARK GRAND OPENING

On Saturday, January 18<sup>th</sup>, Santa Cruz County Parks will celebrate the grand opening of LEO's Haven and Chanticleer Park, which includes the County's first all-inclusive playground and represented the largest community park fundraising effort in County history.

The celebration will include hundreds of community members and numerous partners which helped make the park a reality, including County Parks, Chanticleer Park Neighbors/Vecinos, Shane's Inspiration, Santa Cruz Playground Project and Friends of Santa Cruz County Parks.

Speakers include Patricia Potts, whose children were the inspration for LEO's Haven; Mariah Roberts, executive director of Friends of Santa Cruz County Parks; Supervisor John Leopold; Tiffany Harris, co-founder of Shane's Inspiration; Santa Cruz County Parks Director Jeff Gaffney; and accessibility advocate Haben Girma. Assemblymember Mark Stone will also attend, as will other distinguished guests and public officials.
