RESIDENTS INVITED TO CZU LIGHTNING FIRE ART INSTALLATION

Members of the public and residents who lived through the CZU Lightning Complex fires are invited to special art exhibition beginning May 8, 2021 at the Felton Branch Library and Discovery Park.

The park's accessible nature loop will debut an ongoing installation by local photographer Devi Pride, a fire survivor documenting the impacts of the CZU fires through art. Visitors will also be able to enjoy a self-directed "Storybook Walk" featuring pages from "The Hike," a children's book by Alison Farrell.

"This project is dedicated to everyone who has personally felt the effects of the fires and to this beautiful land we call home," said Pride, owner of Devi Pride Photography. "May we behold the forest as our inspiration for healing as we strive for harmony and balance."
