Animal Shelter Rescues 34 Dogs

The Santa Cruz County Animal Shelter was contacted by a concerned citizen this week regarding numerous dogs being kept in deplorable and inhumane conditions at a residence in the City of Scotts Valley. Animal Shelter Officers were familiar with the address due to previous complaints of dogs being bred at the location.

On June 15, 2017 Animal Shelter Officers obtained an Administrative Warrant through the Superior Court and responded to the location with the Scotts Valley Police Department. Animal Shelter officers confiscated 34 dogs (majority were Boston terriers, some were Tibetan Spaniels and one was a Chihuahua mix) that were not being properly cared for and brought them to the Animal Shelter to be examined by an Animal Shelter veterinarian.

The Santa Cruz County District Attorney's Office has been contacted and is working with the Animal Shelter and Scotts Valley Police Department to investigate the case.

In large scale seizures such as this the resources of the Animal Shelter can be stretched thin and donations can help us properly care for the animals. Donation are welcomed, especially to the Extra Mile fund as some of these dogs are likely to have veterinary complications.
