COME BUILD A PARK, STAY FOR A MOVIE

Supervisor John Leopold and the County of Santa Cruz invites residents to bring the family to help design a park and stay for the kickoff of free Family Movie Nights with a showing of "How to Train Your Dragon 2."

On Friday, June 7 at 6:30 p.m., the Santa Cruz County Department of Parks, Open Space and Cultural Resources will hold the first in a series of public meetings to seek community input on Phase II of the Farm Park, which will include recreational features and related amenities including a proposed pedestrian bridge with connecting ADA trail, playgrounds, skating and bike features, half-court basketball and bocce ball courts, picnic areas with ADA-compliant tables, permanent restrooms, riparian restoration and more.

The "pop-up" community meeting will occur at Heart of Soquel Park Plaza, 4740 Soquel Dr., Soquel (behind Tara Redwood School). An 8 p.m. screening of "How to Train Your Dragon 2" will follow. Low chairs, blankets and jackets recommended. While picnics are welcomed, no alcohol is allowed. G's Mexican Tacos truck will be on hand for those wishing to purchase food.

Summer Family Movies Night returns in 2019 to two locations: Heart of Soquel Park and Felt Street Park. Showings include "Spider-Man: Into the Spider-Verse," "Lego Movie 2," "Incredibles 2," and "Wonder Park."
