

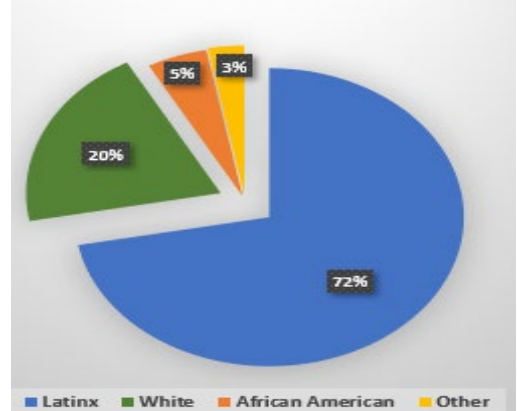
Juvenile Hall Division at-a-Glance 2023

Juvenile Hall provides temporary, secure custody of young people detained by Law Enforcement, Probation, and the Juvenile Court.

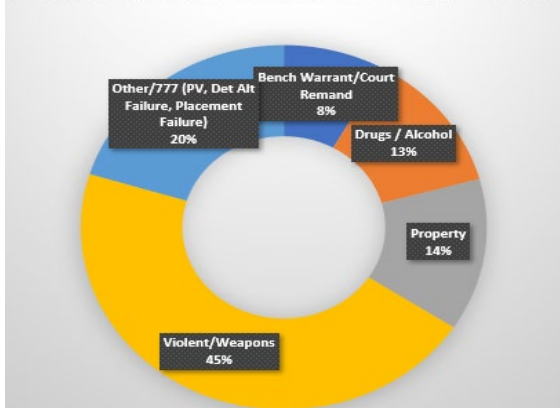
Detention Practices

- Detention Risk Assessment Tool to determine if youth can be safely released pending adjudication.
- Detain only youth who pose a public safety or flight risk
- Youth screened for Commercial Sexual Exploitation of Children <https://ojdp.ojp.gov/programs/sexual-exploitation-children>
- Dual Status MOU: Santa Cruz County Family and Children's Services ("FCS"), Probation Department, and Juvenile Division of the Superior Court team approach to maintain youth/family centered focus, offering equitable responses to youth/families being served by two systems

2023 Juvenile Hall Bookings by Most Serious Offense



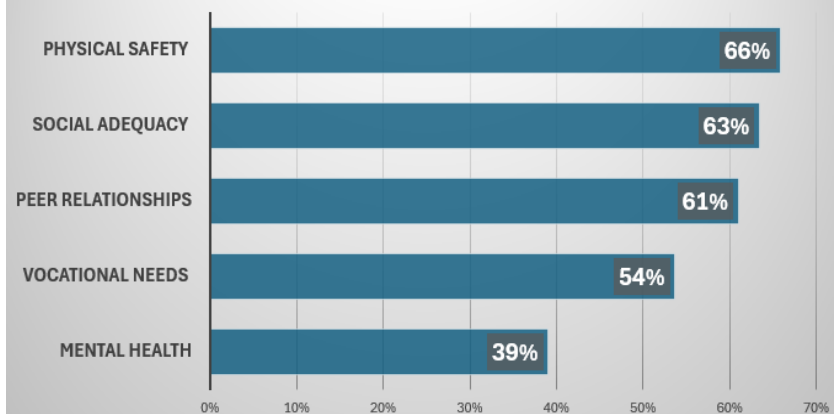
Youth Served

- Juvenile Hall Capacity: 42 youth
- Youth pending adjudication ages 12-18 years
- 53% of Youth Booked Were on Probation
- Youth Served in 2023:
 - 222 youth admitted.
 - Average Daily Population was 10.2.
- A 51% decrease in admissions from 2013, attributed to:
 - Fidelity to Risk Assessment Instrument (RAI)
 - Low percentage of detention overrides
 - Alternative to Detention Programs
 - 98% Successful Completion
- A 14% decrease in length of stay from 2013 attributed to:
 - SB823 & SB 92- youth to be served locally.
 - Stable Transition After Reentry Grant Program
 - Partner with Encompass, Positive Discipline, Conflict Resolution Center

Positive Youth Development through Evidence Based and Culturally Responsive Programming

- Physical and Behavioral Health services provided through HSA. Includes assessments, individual therapy, crisis intervention, case management, referrals & linkages, psychiatry services, substance abuse assessment.
- Multi-Disciplinary Team approach
- Child-Family Team meetings
- Parent Teen Mediation
- Education: Hartman High School, operated by COE
 - Special education instructor, IEP & 504 plans
 - Job, Career, College Coordinator
 - Dual and After Graduation College Enrollment
- Community partnerships:
 - Faith Based Groups
 - Santa Cruz Public Library Services
 - Music in May- music appreciation
 - The Beat Within Writing Workshops
 - Barrios Unidos
 - Unchained (dog training) Program

Juvenile Justice Realignment

- SB 823: transfers responsibility for custody, supervision, & services from the state to local jurisdictions.
- Partnership with Sonoma Probation Secure Youth Treatment Facility (SYTF) to host Santa Cruz youth. Probation provides transport month for families to visit their youth. Tablets and MiFi units available for families to visit virtually with their youth.
- SB 92: young person's case originates in juvenile court may be held in detention until age 25.
