

## **DJJ Commitments by Year**




#### Number of Youth in DJJ at any Given Point by Year




#### Age at Time of Commitment





## **Statistics**

#### 100% Male

- ALOS: 833 Days (2.3 years)
  - Shortest LOS: 43 Days (90-day diagnostic)
  - Longest LOS 1964 Days
- JAIS was implemented in 2012, of youth assessed
  - 41% High Risk Level (7 youth)
  - 53% Moderate Risk Level (9 youth)
  - 6% Low Risk level (1 youth)
- Four Documented MH Diagnosis include
  - Alcohol Use Disorder/Cannabis Use Disorder
  - Conduct Disorder
  - Conduct Disorder and Anxiety
  - Oppositional Defiant Disorder, Alcohol Abuse, Cannabis Abuse and Cocaine Abuse

- 8 Youth Ordered to DJJ for a 90-day Diagnostic
  - 4 Youth returned to us
- ALOS in JH Before Commitment Date: 239 Days
  - Shortest LOS: 21 Days
  - Longest LOS 1084 Days
- ALOS in JH Before Release Date to DJJ: 311 Days
  - Shortest LOS: 44 Days
  - Longest LOS 1228 Days
