




County-Wide Youth Population vs. Probation Youth




Probation Youth Represent .70% of Countywide Youth Population


- 24,189 Youth Aged 10 17 Countywide

Population estimates by the California Department of Finance Probation youth number includes all youth active on November 13, 2020


Juvenile Hall Bookings vs. Admissions



Juvenile Hall Average Daily Population (ADP)




Juvenile Hall Average Daily Population by Ethnicity






Juvenile Arrests - California





Juvenile Arrests – Santa Cruz County




Reduction in STRTP/Group Home Placement Orders Overall Reduction = 81%
