Getting Started



Report to a Probation Office as soon as you leave court or are released from jail.

If you are not able to report in person, you **must** contact the Probation Office by phone or using the following online resources:

If you do not have stable housing, you may provide an address and telephone number where you can be reached or where a message may be left (*with a friend or family*).

Any address or phone # change must be reported immediately.

Can I leave Santa Cruz County or move?

You **MUST HAVE PERMISSION** to leave the State for any length of time, and you will need a written Travel Permit from Probation. In some situations, you may need permission to leave the County (ex: if you are on PRCS supervision or have a registration requirement). If you want to move, you will also need to apply for a transfer (your Probation Officer can help you with that).

Always ask before you go!

Frequently Asked Questions



Who is my Probation Officer?

Until you are assigned to a Probation Officer, you will be provided with a Supervisor's name and phone number in case you have any questions. You can ALWAYS ask to speak with the Officer of the Day (*the Officer of the Day is a designated probation staff in each office*).

What do I do now?

Your Probation Officer will make program and resource referrals. They will also answer any questions you might have and review the terms / conditions you agreed to in court. Together you will make a plan for success!



If you are arrested or cited for a new offense, or if you are stopped and searched, contact Probation within 24 hours (in person, by phone, by email). If your Probation Officer is unavailable, you may leave a voice mail message or speak with the Officer of the Day.
