

How To Be Successful On Supervision





Getting Started - Report to one of the Probation Offices below as soon as you leave court or get released from the jail.

You should be assigned a Probation Officer with 1-week. Until then, you will be provided with a Supervisor's name and phone number in case you have any questions. You can ALWAYS ask to speak with the *Officer of the Day*.

If you cannot report in person for some reason, you must contact reception (see phone numbers above or you can email us with your contact information from our website:

https://www.co.santa-cruz.ca.us/Departments/ProbationDepartment/ContactUs.aspx).

If you do not have a permanent residence, leave an address and telephone number where you can be reached (and tell us if this is a message phone with a friend or family member).

Any address or phone # change must be reported immediately.

NOTE: Providing an email can also assist with communication – if you do not have one, you can get assistance in the Probation Success Center to get a Google Account (see back page for more information on the Success Centers and other resources).

Frequently Asked Questions

What next? You will meet with a Probation Officer to obtain resource referrals, answer any questions you might have, and review the terms / conditions imposed by the court.

Traveling – You MUST HAVE PERMISSION to leave the State for any length of time, and you will need to get a Travel Permit from a Probation representative. In some situations, you may need permission to leave the county (such as on PRCS status) so always ask before you go.

New Arrest/Citation? If you are arrested or cited for a new offense, contact Probation within 24 hours (in person, phone, email). If your Probation Officer is unavailable, you may leave a voice mail message.

Struggling? Remain in contact with Probation at all times! If you have questions or experience challenges <u>always reach out</u>. We have many resources to support you during your time on supervision both at the Probation Success Centers and throughout the community.
