<p><i>The Multi-Disciplinary Interview Center's (MDIC) Protocol which is the core document driving center operations, with the agreement of all stakeholder, contains the following language as one of it's guiding principles: "Allegations of child abuse may first be reported either to law enforcement or to Family and Children's Services, and patrol officers and social workers are ordinarily the first to respond. A coordinated response is an important component of the multidisciplinary approach. The guidelines set forth in this section are intended to avoid duplication of investigative efforts; ensure that steps taken in one investigation do not impede or conflict with the needs of a concurrent investigation; and minimize the number of times child victims are interviewed, especially by different interviewers."</i></p>
