## **Preventing Hunger Dashboard**

- 1. Indicator Name: Preventing Hunger
  - a. Methods
    - i. The primary source of data for CalFresh is the CalWIN data system, which documents all CalWORKs, CalFresh, Medi-Cal, and General Assistance benefits distributed to county residents.
    - ii. CalWIN data include the total amount of funds distributed by month, the demographics and zip codes of households receiving benefits, and the number of applications received and expedited by month.
    - iii. To estimate the number of meals provided by CalFresh, the total amount of CalFresh funds provided to residents per month is divided by an estimate of the average cost of a low-cost meal for a family of four in Santa Cruz county. This average cost is derived from the US Department of Agriculture's national monthly low-cost meal estimates, which are then adjusted to reflect the differential in the cost of food in Santa Cruz county relative to the national average (see "Feeding America" report below).

## b. Limitations

- The estimated number of meals provided by CalFresh assumes that CalFresh recipients are buying low-cost foods and that the average family receiving benefits includes two parents and two children.
- ii. The national meal cost estimates and local cost adjustments may not always reflect current prices.
