3-Day Spay & Neuter Clinic Offers Affordable Services and Media Opportunity Planned Pethood brings Animal Balance for 3-day Event

Santa Cruz County Animal Shelter (SCCAS) and the Santa Cruz County Animal Shelter Foundation are partnering with Animal Balance, a global non-governmental organization, to provide another 200 pets (100 cats and 100 dogs) with low-cost spay/neuter surgeries, core vaccines, and microchips November 15-17 around the corner from the main shelter location, at 2260 7th Avenue in Santa Cruz, CA. There are no additional appointments available, the clinic is fully booked.

The event aims to provide affordable spay and neuter services to local pet owners while promoting and supporting responsible pet ownership. It is not only a valuable service for pet owners, but also a critical step to help reduce overpopulation at the shelter, which has seen steep increases in pet homelessness and intake in recent years.

Journalists and photographers are invited to capture the community impact and heartwarming stories as the shelter works to make a difference in the lives of animals and their families. It will take place from 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. each day, with a team of specially trained veterinarians, veterinary technicians, and volunteers on hand to provide quality care to each animal.

Journalists and media outlets will have access to multiple engaging scenes, including:

- o Pet families arriving for services or to pick up their pets after surgery: Capture the touching bond between pets and their families as they gather to receive essential care or head home.
- o Clinic and veterinary team in action: Show the dedication and skill of veterinary professionals and the protocols that make these clinics, and spay/neuter itself safe, effective, and accessible.
- o Behind-the-scenes volunteer efforts: Highlight local community members giving their time to ensure the event runs smoothly.
- Adoptable pets: Showcase adoptable animals and other resources available through the shelter, like volunteer opportunities and information on responsible pet ownership.
