EVACUATION ORDER INFORMATION

Release Date January 16, 2023 12:00PM

At this point the threat to our waterways flooding in certain areas has decreased. This has been a long and intense 16 days of weather. The Sheriff's Office appreciates the community's cooperation during these difficult times as we take steps to keep our community safe. The Santa Cruz County Sheriff's Office has lifted evacuation warnings for the following zones.

Warnings being lifted:

BOU- E040

FEL-E008, E012

CRZ-E067, E068, E069, E070, E071, E081

CTL-E010, E014, E015, E018, E019, E051

PAJ-E015, E024, E026, E027, E028, E032

Due to continued threat of high tides and surf in the evening hours, coastal roadways of Beach Dr., Las Olas Dr. and Potbelly Beach Rd. the Santa Cruz County Sheriff's Office has determined that the following zones will remain in an evacuation warning status. Please be prepared to evacuate if flooding starts due to these conditions.

Evacuation Warnings staying in effect:

CTL-E031, E048

Due to the failing of a culvert on Whitehouse Canyon Rd. and the continued threat to the failure of the roadway, this area remains in an evacuation order. Additionally, due to the rising river levels of the Pajaro River there remains a concern for potential flooding in these zones. The Sheriff's Office will keep these evacuation orders in effect out of caution for the safety of our



community.
